### Dr. Ted Dupmeier – Glyphosate - The good, the bad & the ugly!

Dr. Ted Dupmeier was raised on a farm in South West Saskatchewan. He graduated from Western Veterinary College receiving his Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) in 1970 and his Masters degree in Veterinary Science (MVSc) in 1977. Dr. Ted started a large animal veterinary practice in Saskatchewan and continues in this practice today.

Throughout his career, Dr. Ted has taken opportunities to explore other avenues of veterinary work. In 2001, he worked in Britain to help with the eradication of Foot and

Mouth disease. In 2014, he taught veterinary medicine in Mongolia.

For the last 10 years, Dr. Ted has been pursuing his interest in glyphosate and its relationship to animals. He began investigating after being unable to diagnose problems in a dairy herd in which cows were inexplicably dying. He said after removing feed that had been sprayed with glyphosate the problems were resolved. Dr. Ted is also seeing a lot more clostridial

problems & believes the problem is that glyphosate acts as an antibiotic, for which it is patented, and kills off good bacteria in the gut.

Problems are also being seen in swine and poultry as well.
